the Early Intervention Program [EIF] is a public program funded by New York State, Nassau and Sutfolk counties, and the NYC Department of Mental Health, and is for children less than three years of age, who have or are suspected of having a developmental delay candor disability. Eligibility for the EIP can be determined only by State approved evaluators under contract with the municipality. If a child is found eligible for the EIP, all services are identified in collaboration with the family and must be authorized by the municipality will arrange for service providers to deliver services authorized by the municipality. All services under the EIP are provided at no out-of-pocket costs to families, but health insurance may be accessed, without affecting your family's benefits. For services provided in community settings that require a fee, the parent is responsible for paying those costs.
